In Memory of Longtime Court Clerk Wendy Leach



Court Clerk Wendy S. Leach passed away on Wednesday, June 10, 2026 at the age of 75.

Wendy was born in Utica on August 5, 1950, the daughter of Curtis and Kathryn (Jones) Sanger. She was raised in Utica and graduated from St. Francis de Sales High School. On November 20, 1971, she was united in marriage to Kevin K. Leach, beginning a loving and devoted union that spanned nearly 55 years. For more than three decades, Wendy served as the Court Clerk for the Schuyler Town Court. A woman of strong faith and community involvement, Wendy was a member of St. Mark's Church in North Utica, the Catholic Women's Club, and the Magistrates Association. She found great enjoyment in tending to her flowers and treasured the time she spent at the St. Lawrence River. Above all, Wendy was devoted to her family. Her greatest happiness came from the love she shared with them, especially her cherished grandchildren and great-grandchildren, who were truly the light of her life and brought her endless pride and joy.

Town Justice Dale Christie, who worked alongside Wendy, described her as a dear friend and someone who would light up the room with her presence. She was a dedicated public servant, never missing a day even through injuries, sickness, or the COVID-19 pandemic. For 33 years Wendy was relentless in obtaining numerous grants and security for the Schuyler Court, and successfully ensured that the magistrate meetings were well attended.

Wendy is a dear friend who cared about her job, the Judges and staff she worked with, and treated the public with respect and dignity, never missing an opportunity to lend an ear or help when she could.

Our deepest condolences go out to Wendy's family friends. Rest in peace and God Speed.



Planning Board Meeting - June 3, 2026

Planning Board Members Present Were:

Chairman Costanza opened the meeting at 6:00 P.M. and led the people in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Motion to Approve Minutes:

Motion by Fusillo, second by Digristina to approve May 6, 2026 Planning Board minutes; all in favor.

‘Project Mohawk’ presentation by applicant SunCap Property Group, LLC:

Patrick Theodossiou and Jason Inantak presented their proposal for a warehouse project in the business park. Detailed specs were given regarding water, sewage, and septic; as well as other environmental and DEC regulations. They anticipate that the traffic impact will be low. Some permits and clearances are still waiting for approval.

Board members asked about what type of vehicles would be coming in and out (there will be 20 tractor trailer parking spots), employment, and the water run-off (being Schuylerville doesn't have a sewer system). They will be building a retention pond.

IDA CEO John Piseck provided some insight regarding the traffic concerns. Most should be on off-peak hours.

It was agreed that due to the Fourth of July celebrations at Herkimer College that the July Planning Board meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 7th at 6 P.M. Representatives from Project Mohawk will return to provide additional information regarding the project.

Motion to Adopt Resolution of Intent to Act as Lead Agency for Project Mohawk:

Motion by Tripoli, second by Digristina; all in favor.

Motion to Close Meeting:

There being no additional business, a motion to close the Planning Board meeting was made at 6:25 P.M. by Digristina, second by Fusillo; all in favor.

UNITED STATES FLAG ETIQUETTE

This year, we've been seeing an increase in the number of flags flying in our country. Did you know that there are right ways and wrong ways to fly Old Glory? Are you flying yours correctly?

When flying our flag among other flags, ours should be the highest. If our flag is displayed on a wall, the union (stars) should be displayed uppermost and to the observer's left. When flying it on a staff on a stage, the US Flag should be on the speaker's right (facing the audience); if other flags are displayed at the same time, they should be placed on the speaker's left. When worn as a lapel pin, it should be worn on the left lapel—near the heart.



In many parades, our flag is carried by the participants. At the moment the flag passes, all non-uniformed persons should stand at attention facing the flag with their right hands over their hearts. Persons in uniform should face the flag and render the military salute. In processions, the flag should be to the right of the marchers. When other flags or banners are included, the US Flag should be centered in front of the others or carried to their right.

Flying the US Flag at half-staff, or on a ship at half mast, is an honored tradition which signifies that the nation is in mourning due to the death of a prominent citizen. To position the flag at half-staff, first hoist the flag to the peak of the staff for an instant before lowering it to the half-staff position which is roughly halfway between the top and bottom of the staff. Before lowering it for the day, raise the flag again to the peak for an instant, then lower it.

During memorials or burials and funerals, the flag should lay over the casket with the blue field covering the head and left shoulder. The flag must not be lowered into the grave or allowed to touch the ground at any time.

When our National Anthem is sung or played, citizens should stand and face the flag. A non-uniformed person wearing a hat must remove it with the right hand and hold it against the left shoulder, right hand resting over the heart. Those in uniform must stand at attention and salute the flag. (Note: If the flag is not displayed during the National Anthem, face the music instead.)

We learned in grade school that we should stand at attention facing the flag with our right hands over our hearts when we recite the Pledge of Allegiance. Persons in uniform should remain silent, face the flag and render the military salute.

Display the flag only between sunrise and sunset on buildings and stationary flagstaffs. It may be flown at night if it is illuminated. Do not display the flag in inclement weather.

When not on display, the flag should be respectfully folded into a triangle, symbolizing the tricorne hats worn by colonial soldiers in the Revolutionary War. For instructions on how to properly fold the US Flag, please visit NationalFlagFoundation.org. They have more etiquette tips plus history about our flag.

I hope you learned or were reminded of US Flag etiquette. Our flag represents us around the world and is our long-standing national symbol. We owe respect not only to the Red, White, and Blue, but for the men and women who make it possible for us to live freely.

Town Board Meeting - June 10, 2026

Town Board Members Present:

Supervisor John Werczynski, Councilmen Dale Dodge, Joe Juliano, Eric Kane, and George Luther III.

Also Present Were:

Supervisor Werczynski called the regular meeting before the Town of Schuyler Town Board to order at 6:00P.M. at the Schuyler Town Office, 2090 State Route 5, Utica, NY and led the people in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Moment of Silence:

Supervisor Werczynski requested a moment of silence as the Town learned of Wendy Leach's passing earlier in the day.

Motion to Approve the Minutes:

Motion made by Juliano; seconded by Luther to approve the Town Clerk's minutes from May 13, 2026, meeting; all in favor.

Motion to Pay Bills:

Motion made by Dodge; seconded by Kane to approve bills as presented; all in favor.

Update from Herkimer County Legislator:

Herkimer County Legislator Lucenti reported that the County is still working on the Children's Center providing nine different services and has found a location for the center.

Lucenti stated the Summer Youth Program is still available to any youths looking for summer employment. The deadline for applications is ending soon.

Lastly, Lucenti reported an e-mail was received, Schuyler did not get LGD grant for West Schuyler Water. The County is waiting for Northern Borders' decision.

Town Clerk Report:

AFLAC Representative Becki Pitcher informed the Board of some upcoming changes and additions to the policies. On June 24, 2026, Becki will be on-site to talk with employees that may have questions. She reminded the Board that open enrollment is in August.

Town Clerk Report cont'd.:

NBT Insurance Representative Yuliya Karpov presented the Board with the 2026/2027 renewal policy. The policy has some updates that will go into effect. The Board members requested that NBT look at ways to save the Town money with the policy. Yuliya will look into that request.

Town Clerk Salamone stated NYS has implemented a new law that offers residents to donate to the local shelter when they renew their dog license(s). A year-end donation will be made to the Herkimer County Humane Society. Supervisor Werczynski made a shelter donation.

Town Clerk Salamone requested extra checks for emergencies.

Board Member Kane requested that Town Clerk Salamone order flowers for Wendy Leach.

Codes Officer Report:

Town Supervisor Werczynski read the Codes report. Nineteen permits have been issued, inspections have been conducted, multiple complaints and follow-ups addressed, along with numerous zoning and informational inquiries handled.

Motion made by Juliano; seconded by Kane for the approval of updated permit fee schedule except for the roof fee; all in favor.

Highway Report:

Superintendent of Highways Philip Johnson reported that over Memorial Day weekend, the highway department's pole barn and enclosed trailers were broken into. A pole saw, plate tamper and three weed eaters were taken along with some damage to the trailer. He submitted a claim to the insurance company. Board Members are discussing increasing security around town properties. Johnson also informed the Board as to work the crew has been doing.

Assessors Report:

Grievance Day was held on May 27, 2026. Jean Finster acted as Chairperson of the BAR as appointed Chairman was absent. One homeowner showed up for the BAR members to assess. Dates for Final Roll will be July 1, 2026.

Supervisor Report:

Supervisor Werczynski reminded residents that the 2nd Dumpster weekend will be Saturday June 13th and Sunday June 14th.

Lucenti commented that in order to resubmit for a grant, a Public Hearing is required.

Supervisor Report cont'd.:

Supervisor Werczynski read aloud Resolution No.4 of 2026 to the Board members. The resolution is to schedule a public hearing for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding the West Schuyler -Brown, Graham, Newport Road- Water Project. Town Clerk Salamone will publish the notice of hearing in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. The Public Hearing will be held on Wednesday, July 8, 2026, at 5:45 P.M. prior to the regular Town Board meeting. Motion by Dodge; seconded by Juliano to approve resolution and publish public notice; all in favor.

Lucenti commented that in order to resubmit for a grant, a Public Hearing is required.

Planning Board and IT Report:

Secretary Jeffery Dingman presented the Board with a quote from CCNY to eliminate the mini hubs by updating the computer's wiring system to be hardwired in the Town Clerk's office.

Motion made by Kane; seconded by Juliano to approve the work to be completed for amount of \$845.00; all in favor.

The Planning Board met on Wednesday, June 3, 2026. SunCap Property Group had a presentation for a warehouse project (Project Mohawk) to build a 143,000 square foot warehouse. Dingman will send the project information to Herkimer-Oneida County Planning Board for review. The next Planning Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 7, 2026. A Public Hearing will be scheduled thereafter.

Juliano asked if all Planning Board members are up to date on training. Dingman is making sure the training is done.

Zoning Board of Appeals Report:

Secretary Dingman stated some members of the Planning and Zoning Board attended the Land Use Training Course at Griffiss Institute in Rome, NY.

Juliano asked for the status of updating the zoning maps. Dingman responded that they are continuing to update the map. Juliano commented on the importance of updating the map because of all the new businesses coming into Schuyler.

Water Board Report:

Mohawk Valley Water Authority representative Dale Dodge stated the next meeting will be held on Monday, June 15, 2026. More presentations will be coming.

Schuyler Extravaganza:

Chairman Cosmo Pellegrino updated the Board with plans and some requests for the Extravaganza. Pellegrino received donations from local businesses. He stated the Town contributes every year. There will be vendors, food trucks, live music and a fireworks display. Two residents are donating funds and Byrne Dairy made also donations.

Schuyler Extravaganza cont'd.:

Motion made by Juliano; seconded by Kane to contribute funds for the Extravaganza; all in favor.

Motion to add an Extravaganza voucher to the bills made by Dodge; seconded by Kane; all in favor.

Public Comment:

Herkimer IDA Chairman Bono stated the members from Project Mohawk were very impressed how organized the County, Town (Town and Planning Boards), and IDA are on Schuyler's projects. An announcement will be coming soon. This company will bring in 200 jobs.

Bono stated another 35 acres is being looked at by the same owner to build another similar warehouse soon.

Bono also stated that Northern Borders did announce the award of \$1 million dollars for the (200-foot, glass-lined) water tower in the Schuyler Business Park. It will be the highest tank in New York State.

Resident Chris Proulx updated the Board members on the Little Library that is fully stocked with books purchased from the donations of John Werczynski and Paul McLean. Town residents are already utilizing the "Take a Book, Leave a Book" program. Chris plans on coordinating a grand opening photo-op to be announced.

Chris spoke about the Community Picnic on Sunday, August 16, 2026. Raffle tickets are available through any Historical Society member or at the Town Clerk's office. Tickets are \$1 each or 6 tickets for \$5. Chris reviewed the prizes residents can win.

Chris also reminded the Town about the Bake Sale scheduled on Tuesday, June 23, 2026 during Primary Election Day. If any residents would like to bring baked goods, please drop them off at the table by 9 A.M.

Town Clerk Salamone reminded the Board members the Town Clerk's office will be closed on Tuesday, June 23, 2026.

Resident Michael T Lavelle III expressed his concerns for the property on the Watkins Road Solar Project. Mr. Lavella stated the project has been sold to another company. Lucenti suggested the Town write a letter to the new owners of the project to sit down and find out the status. The new owners do not have a permit to proceed with the project.

Motion made by Juliano; seconded by Kane to send a letter to the new project owners of the Watkins Solar Project; all in favor.

Resident Rick Proulx inquired about the Town purchasing a new vacuum. After discussion, it was agreed to purchase a new vacuum.

Resident Harry Robbins reminded the Town members of Primary Election Day on June 23, 2026. He also suggested we might want to put something in the newsletter about job opportunities that might be available at Byrne Dairy.

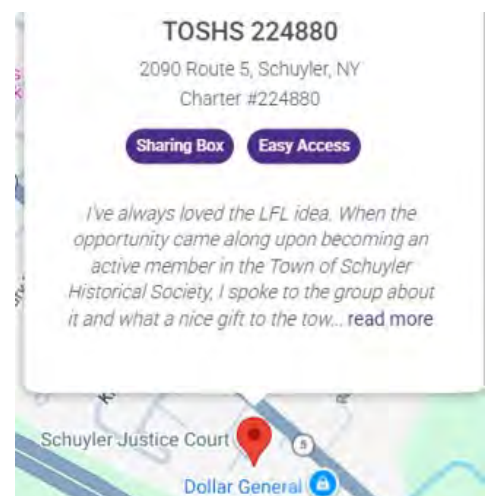
