He will discuss the 9 easements (signatures of property owners) that are needed for the project to progress and whom he is still waiting on. In 9 areas of the project, the water line, which runs alongside the roadway, slightly encroached on private property, thereby requiring the easements.

The Schuyler Chronicles

Issue # 5 - October 2024

The leaves on the trees are changing and there is that fall crispness in the air. In rural areas that means it's harvest time. This month I'm going to share with you some information about an interesting machine that is on display in the Town of Schuyler Historical Society Exhibit Room. It is a foot-operated corn-stalk cutter. It was made in the early 1900's and it is rudimentary—but it got the job done. The cornstalks were cut down in the fields and brought to the barnyard by wagonload. The corncobs were removed and were processed to be used as feed. The stalks were then placed in the wooden tray and pushed toward the blades. With a firm foot action, the blades would slice through the stalks and fall into a pail. This action would continue until a whole field of cornstalks was turned into silage and stored in a silo. Who is ready to give up their John Deere machinery and try this for a day?



This fascinating piece of farm machinery was donated to the TOS Historical Society by John Papierski of Hawthorne Gulf Road.

Please take notice that a Public Hearing will be held by the Town Board of the Town of Schuyler on November 13, 2024 at 5:30 P.M. at the Schuyler Town Hall, 2090 State Route 5, Utica, NY 13502 regarding the adoption of the following Local Law:

Introductory Local Law #10 of 2024 to Rezone Certain Parcels in the Town of Schuyler. This Local Law proposes the rezoning of parcels 104.2-1-34.3, 104.11-1-10.1 and 104.11-1-10.2 from Residential-2 (R-2) to Commercial Highway (C-H) on NYS Route 5. Each parcel is currently partially zoned both R-2 and C-H.

The proposed Local Law is available for inspection during regular business hours in the Office of the Town Clerk, 2090 State Route 5, Utica, NY 13502. Any resident of the Town of Schuyler is entitled to be heard upon said proposed Local Law.

STAR Information from Assessor George Haskell



STAR Applications for 2025 must be submitted prior to March 1st 2025. To receive the STAR Credit or exemption, you must own your home and it must be your primary residence.

Basic STAR

- The property must be the primary residence of an owner.*
- No age restriction
- \$500,000 or less for the STAR credit
- \$250,000 or less for the STAR exemption
- The income limit applies to the combined incomes of only the owners and owners' spouses who reside at the property.

Enhanced STAR

- The property must be the primary residence of at least one age-eligible owner.
- 65 or older
- All owners must be at least age 65 as of December 31 of the year of the exemption, except where the property is jointly owned by only a married couple or only siblings, in which case only one owner needs to meet the age requirement.
- Surviving spouses may be eligible to retain the Enhanced STAR benefit. See Surviving spouse eligibility.**
- For 2024 benefits: \$98,700 or less
- For 2025 benefits: \$107,300 or less
- The income limit applies to the combined incomes of all owners (residents and non-residents), and any owner's spouse who resides at the property.

Ownership

- The property must be owned by the eligible applicant(s).
- A married couple can receive only one STAR benefit regardless of how many properties they own, unless they are legally separated.
- Purchaser(s) in possession of the home under an executory contract of sale (aka land contract) are considered owners(s).
- Corporations, partnerships, and LLCs are not eligible unless it is a farm dwelling.

Any new exemptions **MUST** be filed prior to March 1st 2025.

Planning Board Members Present:

Vice Chairman David Fusillo, Dale Dodge, Michael Ritter, James Digristina, Daniel Tripoli, and Catherine Nimey. Absent was Chairman Victor Costanza and Jean Finster.

Also Present Were:

Councilman Joseph Juliano, Attorney Will Wallace, Jim Bono, Jack Bono, and Lou Mastroianni.

Vice-Chairman Fusillo opened the meeting at 6:00 P.M. and led the people in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Motion to Approve Minutes:

Motion by Dale Dodge, second by Jean Finster to approve the August 7, 2024 Planning Board minutes; all in favor.

Public Hearing on Application by Diversified Wireless, Inc.:

- Vice-Chairman David Fusillo opened the public hearing. Attorney William D. Wallace, II explained the application in that Diversified Wireless currently leases land from the Bono Brothers, and would like to purchase the land and consolidate Tax Parcels 112.2-2-48, 112.1-2-30 and 112.2-2-47 to create one parcel at 3421 State Route 5. There is a general contractor's office at this site. The site is currently zoned Commercial-Industrial. This process would facilitate conveyance to Diversified Wireless, Inc. from Bono Brothers. Attorney Wallace also indicated that this project doesn't qualify as a subdivision as there are no new parcels being created.
- Public Comment: None.
- Board Comment: Dan Tripoli asked if the fence would remain the same – attorney Wallace indicated it would.
- Motion by Jim Digristina, second by Dan Tripoli to close the Diversified Wireless, Inc. public hearing; all in favor.
- Motion by Dale Dodge, second by Dan Tripoli for resolution that the Planning Board would become the lead agency for the Diversified Wireless, Inc. project; all in favor. Secretary Dingman indicated that we are still awaiting confirmation from Herkimer-Oneida County Planning, so this resolution would be pending their response.

Town Board Meeting - October 9, 2024

**** Town Board Minutes Being Provided as Courtesy - Not Officially Approved ****

Supervisor Lucenti called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M., and led the assembled people in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Council Members Present:

Supervisor Anthony Lucenti, Councilmen Rodney Dodge, Joe Juliano, Eric Kane, and Councilwoman Bette Szesny.

Also Present Were:

Town Clerk Barbara J. Boulia, Superintendent of Highways Philip Johnson, Clerk to Supervisor Jeffery Dingman, Assessor George Haskell, Codes Enforcement Officer Phil Green, and Town Attorney Mark Wolber. Town Residents present were: Clarence Caldwell, Donald Haman, Tommy Wheeler, Frank Paratore, Ron and Ruby Beach, Tim Riecker, Martin Ruller, Harry Robbins, and JoAnn Mammone.

Barry Viggiano - C2AE Update on West Schuyler Water District:

Supervisor Lucenti said Barry Viggiano is waiting for two agencies to reply. He thinks the bidding will go out by end of October. He also said he received a call from Mr. Lynch from Syracuse University and they want to help with the water project. Hey said they work for small communities.

Minutes of September 11, 2024:

Motion by Kane, second by Juliano that the minutes of September 11, 2024 be approved as printed; all in favor.

Pay Bills:

Motion by Szesny, second by Juliano that the bills be paid as presented; all in favor. Supervisor Lucenti said there was a question on the repair of the building. Councilman Kane asked if we paid the sales tax on the repair. The Town Clerk said the Town of Schuyler is tax exempt. He said, no, we have to pay the sales tax because it is an insurance claim. The Supervisor asked Councilman Kane who told you this; his reply was the contractor.

Assessor Report by George Haskell:

Assessor George Haskell said he visits the Business Park one a week to see if there are any changes. He said he has not found anything going on. Supervisor Lucenti said we should be getting more PILOT money than we are getting now.

Codes Enforcement Officer Philip Green:

Codes Officer Phil Green said so far he as issued 40 permits and 15 codes violations. He said he has two hearings scheduled for October 16 and two for October 30, 2024. He also said the sign problem has been taken care of.

Supervisor's Report:

Planning Board Zoning Change Approval - Paratore Property

Supervisor Lucenti said there will be a Public Hearing on November 13, 2024 at 5:30 P.M. to rezone parcels 104.2-1-34.3, 104.11-1-10-1 and 104.11-1-10.2 to Commercial Highway. He said this will be a Local Law for 2024 - Number 10.

Motion by Szesny, second by Juliano authorizing the meeting to be held at 5:30 P.M. regarding rezoning parcels 104.2-1-34.3, 104.11-1-10-1 and 104.11-1-10.2 to Commercial Highway; all in favor.

Oneida County Sewer District Intermunicipal Agreement

Supervisor Lucenti said we have been part of Oneida County Sewer, which was established since 1965. He said they treat waste water and have received \$26 million for improvements. Supervisor Lucenti said they sent him a resolution to sign.

Motion by Dodge, second by Juliano that the Supervisor of the Town of Schuyler signs the resolution; all in favor.

BRIC FEMA Grant - No Update from Joshua Pearlman or James Cori

Supervisor Lucenti said he has received no call from Pearlman's office. He said James Cori told him that he thinks he can contest the grant.

Water District Easements - Awaiting 9 Resident Signatures

Supervisor Lucenti said they are waiting for nine resident signatures. He asked the Town Clerk if she received any of them. Her reply was no.

Town Court Application for JCAP Grant

Supervisor Lucenti said he received a request from Schuyler Court to apply for a grant and they need a motion. He said they want to digitize their records.

Motion by Dodge, second by Juliano authorizing the Court Clerk to proceed with the grant for digitizing; all in favor.

Budget Meeting - Tentative Budge; Set Public Hearing for November 7th at 6:00 P.M.

Supervisor Lucenti said the employees of Schuyler will receive a 5% raise. He said the previous budget will be the same for this year, except for Light District and Sewer District, which is up. He also said the Town of Schuyler Fire Company wanted a \$56,000.00 raise due to new mandates, and have settled for \$25,000.00. He also said both East and West Schuyler Cemeteries will have \$2,500.00 each for mowing.
